The meeting came to order at 1:10pm

K-12 Dual Language Taskforce

The Dual Language Taskforce is exploring the continuation of the Dual Immersion program into high school. The pathway will continue to be vetted with the committee and will eventually be brought to curriculum council.

Summer School

The free summer school program will take place at Agoura High School June 17th - July 25th, 2019. Freshman Seminar, Moorpark College elective courses, and Credit Recovery are all being offered. Ashley Wenter and Martin Freel are the Summer School Principals. At the time of this meeting Ms. Wenter reported 158 students confirmed for Freshman Seminar with a waitlist of 58. 40 seats are being held for the possibility of students needing to retake the course. The Moorpark courses are hovering at 20 people, and Ashley and Marty are working with the school sites to fill the classes to at least 30, which is the minimum required roster. Credit Recovery will

be done through Apex, but students will be doing the work on campus with support teachers available. 95 are currently confirmed, with room for up to 300 students for Credit Recovery.

Student 360 Update

The Student 360 Committee has added some elementary parents after the committee began to become secondary heavy. Challenge Success at Stanford has accepted the LVUSD application and there will be professional development training done starting in summer 2019. This training comes from Title 2 funding and will look at homework and grading practices.

Math Pathways

The committee is beginning to review the math pathways in secondary, including the data of how 3 semester Algebra 2 affects students trajectory. More data will be brought to the committee for more discussion.

Center EdX

We have 60 people who have expressed interest in the SPED Capacity Grant Scholarship that will be run out of Center EdX. The deadline for that application is April 12.

Career Education

Mr. Gleason in conjunction with Dr. McClay is applying for a million dollar matching grant to build up Agoura High's Schools career pathways with a corporate sponsorship. Megan Glynn of the YMCA is also working with Mr. Gleason on a grant application through the Anthem Foundation for physical wellness at middle schools.

HS Bell Schedules

Votes will begin this week at both high schools on a common bell schedule.
